## Sessions for Summer 2011 at Sarehole Mill

Sarehole Mill is a beautiful working water mill set in Hall Green in the suburbs of Birmingham with lots to offer your children for a school visit. Here's a selection of what we can provide this summer.

### Foundation Stage

'Wheels at the Mill' uses familiar rhymes and stories along with a craft activity to explore the mill. This new session is receiving excellent feedback.

### KS1 - Little Red Hen

Children participate in the traditional story and then make bread. A wonderful way to learn about the mill.

### KS2 - Our Daily Bread.

The children learn how the mill turns wheat into flour before having a go themselves. Finally the pupils make bread to take back to school.

### KS2 - Feel the Force

An interactive session looking at forces at work in the mill. Children find out about friction, gravity, gears and pulleys, then investigate what happens and why.

### KS2 - Materials / Can Buildings Speak?

Pupils explore the buildings and materials of the mill and learn about materials such as clay, wood, glass, metal and stone through engaging activities.

### KS2 - Water Water Everywhere... River Studies

We can tailor this to your Geography schemes of work investigating the River Cole or alternatively we can combine it with cross-curricular activities.

### KS2 - The Miller's Apprentice

This is an interactive session to find out about Victorian childhood. The children become miller's apprentices and find out first hand about the dust, the dirt, the dangers and the poor working conditions. Pupils also learn about superstitions and tales surrounding mills.

### Magical Mill Themed Days

Up to 60 children can attend every fun-filled, action packed half-day session. Perfect for end of year rewards.

Dates: **4th – 8th July 2011**

Times: **10am-12pm or 1pm – 3pm**

During the session, pupils play Victorian games, explore visual illusions, make a Victorian scrapbook, listen to traditional Miller's tales and look for clues to solve the mystery.
