## Taught Sessions

### Capturing the Castle

- Using artefacts and costume, pupils learn about the lives of rich and poor in the medieval period.

### Archaeology

- Using a variety of archaeological techniques, pupils collate, date and learn to piece together the material evidence of what life was like in the past.

- Pupils will explore a range of natural environments and habitats and learn about the minibeasts that live in them.
